PARENTS: It is important that you read this Handbook in its entirety. Upon registering, you will sign a statement indicating you have read and agree to follow the policies and procedures as stated in the Handbook.

OUR ACTIVITIES

SWIMMING

Campers will have lots of fun cooling off in our pool and sliding down our tube slides! Closely supervised by certified lifeguards and Group Leaders. Our lifeguards are on duty any time there are campers in the pool area. All campers are expected to dress out every day for swim time. Beginning of the week, swim test for each camper.

WORD

Through age appropriate and creative teaching, the campers will learn of God's love and how to apply the Word of God to their lives. They'll discover to fear not, because God is with us.

PRAISE

Campers will get to sing, stomp, clap, dance, praise, sign, and let loose in this activity where they express themselves and learn the Word of God through various forms of Christian music.

EXPRESSIONS

Children will have a chance to play indoor games to help build group unity. They will participate in weekly contests against other groups.

OUTDOOR GAMES (ODG)

The children will be led in a variety of exciting games in the open, fresh outdoors in our large gated field. Campers only go to ODG in the mornings.

ARTS & CRAFTS

Your child will explore a creative side with weekly projects and activities.

GYM GAMES

Children will be able to play exciting team games that will promote group unity as well as skill in relating to others. These games will be led by our trained Instructors.

GAME ROOM

Foosball, table games, Legos, and video games of all sorts are available to the campers during Game Room time. All games are rated "E" on our Wiis, Play Stations 3&4, and X-Box 360s.

CHAPEL

Campers will gather together in the church every Thursday for praise and worship through dance, drama, song, and stories from the Word. Parents are invited to come and worship with us.

ASSEMBLIES

We will have assemblies with activities and skits to celebrate the theme of the week. Weekly costume contest for the theme of the week! Every Friday we have a special assembly to close each week. Parents are invited.

SPECIAL EVENT

Every Friday there is a special themed event for the whole camp.

WEEKLY THEMES & DATES

Many of the activities and events during the week focus on the weekly theme based on our summer theme of FEARLESS. Each week campers will discover a new character of God. Every Friday we will have a Special Event incorporated into the weekly theme. We encourage kids to dress up according to the theme for Friday assemblies. Below is a list of the weekly themes, dates, and bible verses.

WEEK 1 (JUNE 4TH-8TH): MORE POWERFUL THAN A LOCOMOTIVE

Welcome to the beginning of a Fearless summer with Super Hero Week! Kids will learn to *Fear Not, God Is Powerful!* So come be like Superman, powerful as locomotive. On Friday, campers dress up as their favorite super hero, and they will get to create their own super hero. (MEMORY VERSE: Isaiah 41:10)

WEEK 2 (JUNE 11TH-15TH): WONDERFUL WORLD OF DISNEY

Come learn to *Fear Not, God is Wonderful* during Disney Week. Join us for our favorite Disney songs and characters all week long. Dress up as your favorite Disney princess, dashing hero, or Pixar character on Friday. Get your Disney memory ready and grab Pluto for an epic game of Clue to track down the missing Spirit Stick. (MEMORY VERSE: Psalm 139:14)

WEEK 3 (JUNE 18TH-22ND): BALL DON'T LIE

Bring out the pom poms, pull out the cleats, and get the ball dribbling during Sports Week. Learn how to *Fear Not, God is True*. Join us on Friday for everyone's most anticipated game of the season, the Annual Staff Basketball Game! Come Friday representing your favorite sports team and cheer on your favorite staff! (MEMORY VERSE: Proverbs 30:5)

WEEK 4 (JUNE 25TH-29TH): 'Til The Cows Come Home

Bring them cows on home and get the fiddle a playin', it's everyone's favorite week... East Hillbilly Week. Learn to *Fear Not, God is Faithful*. Join us Friday for our Annual East Hillbilly Carnival. Don't forget to deck out in your plaid, overalls, cowboy hats, and hillbilly digs. (MEMORY VERSE: Deuteronomy 31:6)

WEEK 5 (JULY 2ND-6TH): LIBERTY & JUSTICE FOR ALL

Join the stars and stripes and salute our flag for 4th of July Week as we celebrate our nation! Learn how to *Fear Not, God is Just & Fair*. Dress up Friday in your best red, white, blue, stars, and stripes outfit as campers play a new type of capture the flag. (MEMORY VERSE: Daniel 4:37)

WEEK 6 (JULY 9TH-13TH): GRACE LIKE RAIN

The heat is beaming, the water is flowing, and we're diving into Water Week. Bring out the sunglasses as campers see how to *Fear Not, God is Gracious & Merciful*. Dress up Friday in your best beach attire and island swag. Come ready to battle it out at the epic water relays and submerge your favorite staffer or two. (MEMORY VERSE: Exodus 34:6)

WEEK 7 (JULY 16TH-20TH): LOVE NEVER MELTS

Join us for CHRISTmas in July and learn how to *Fear Not, God is Love!* Celebrate the love that is Christ. Come join the dancing and praising in the true Christmas spirit. Dress up Friday in comfy Christmas pajamas/costume and join in the hilarious photo scavenger hunt. (MEMORY VERSE- John 3:16)

WEEK 8 (JULY 23RD-27TH): NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP

Hitch a ride and take a step back in time during Decades Week. Come learn to *Fear Not, God is Forever*. Friday, dress up in your most happenin' 50s, swingin' 60s, discoing 70s, and trendiest 80s outfits. Closing out the week cheering on favorite staff with an epic and hilarious Staff Lip-Sync Battle. (MEMORY VERSE: Matthew 28:19-20)

WEEK 9 (JULY 30TH-AUGUST 3RD): THE GOOD RACE

Ready... set... run a Good Race during The Race Week. Campers will learn to *Fear Not, God is Good*. Take part in an epic week full of team games, relays, and fun activities that ultimately lead up to Friday's Mega Relay! Wear group colors and make up cheers for extra points all week long. Make it to the top for the ultimate win! (MEMORY VERSE: Psalm 100:5)

week 10 (august 6th-10th): we're all a little weird

Come end the summer with Wacky Tacky Week! Campers will learn how we are all wacky but to *Fear Not, God is Perfect*. Dress up on Thursday (not Friday) in your craziest, wackiest, and tackiest outfit to close out the summer with an amazing assembly! (MEMORY VERSE: Psalm 18:30)

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

HOW CAMP GROUPS ARE FORMED

Each camper will be placed in a group according to the grade they previously completed. Staff members are assigned to provide the appropriate adult/child ratio for each group. **It is possible for a camper's group number to change during the summer.** We try to avoid this; however, enrollment fluctuations from week to week may cause this to happen.

There are Group Leaders assigned to each group. They will lead the children to the activities where the Instructor will have a planned lesson or game. Group Leaders assist the Instructor and help the campers in the activities.

PARTICIPATION IS MANDATORY

All children are required to participate in all activities. Due to the size and nature of the camp, we cannot allow children to choose whether or not they participate. *(Please read swimming procedures carefully)*. Children who are not participating in group activities are a distraction to other children and cannot be properly supervised. Active participation in group activities by all group members promotes group unity and boosts morale. **If there is a physical concern that prohibits your child from participating on a certain day, we must receive a note from a parent or guardian explaining the situation. A doctor's note is required if a concern would prohibit certain activities for multiple days.**

SWIMMING POLICIES

Campers will go swimming every day, as long as weather permits. Every camper is required to dress out for swim. Any child who does not want to swim, will be required to sit next to the pool dressed out. Safety at the pool is always our top priority; staff cannot be allocated to watch a child separate from the group at swim time. We have certified lifeguards and staff on deck when the pool is in use. Entrances to the pool area are locked when pool is closed.

Campers will need to wear modest bathing suits. Goggles and masks are permitted but flotation devices, diving sticks, flippers, and toys are not. Staff may assist campers with application of aerosol sunscreen but not liquid. Please put initials on campers' goggles, towels, and items so that any missing items may be returned.

Campers will go swimming at his or her group's assigned swim time each day. Swim time will not be made up for bad weather or absences. As part of our safety procedure, each camper is required to take a swim test every Monday to be allowed certain access to areas in the pool.

WHAT TO WEAR

Campers should wear jeans or shorts, t-shirts, socks, tennis shoes, and a BIG smile. Please make sure your camper's clothing is modest and appropriate. Clothing should allow for campers to engage and participate in all activities. Please label all belongings.

WHAT NOT TO WEAR

Please do not send your camper to camp in revealing clothes, inappropriate slogans, or anything that will encourage inappropriate attention. Shirts must completely cover stomach and chest. Shorts should not be too short, and underwear should never be visible. Their shoes must not prevent them from participating. We strongly discourage campers wearing flip-flops or dresses due to the physical activity during the day. **If a child arrives to camp inappropriately dressed, the parents will be called and asked to bring appropriate clothing for the child.**

WHAT CAMPERS SHOULD BRING EACH DAY

1. Any camper NOT registered to receive a hot lunch (refer to pg. 16) will need to bring a lunch with their name and group on it.
 - **Please do not forget your child's lunch.** We cannot provide your child with a lunch if you fail to do so.
 - **HOT LUNCH** numbers are set on Monday each week by 9:15am.
 - **Note: We do not refrigerate or microwave** the lunches. Lunches are kept inside at room temperature until it is time for the campers to eat lunch.
2. All campers will need to bring a swimsuit and towel in a bag with a drawstring. Upon registration, each child will receive a swim bag according to his/her group color. (If broken, a replacement can be purchased.) **Please label each item with your child's first and last name.**

A FEW THINGS NOT TO BRING

1. Toys and any other items that may cause distractions.
2. Do not allow your child to wear anything that could be damaged, lost, or cause injury to themselves or others such as watches, bracelets, earrings and other jewelry. **We will not be liable for the loss, theft, or damage to toys or other personal items.**
3. Children are not allowed to carry backpacks or purses during the day.
4. Children may not bring any media such as books, videos, DVD's, cell phones, iPods, video games, laptops, tablets, etc. Please enforce these rules with your child.

CELL PHONES ARE PROHIBITED

- If your child brings a cell phone it will be taken away and returned to you at the end of the day.
- East Hill is not liable for any damaged, lost, or stole cell phones.



- By keeping cell phones at home, this helps ensure this won't happen.
- You may call the front office at any time to contact your child.
- If under certain circumstance the cell phone needs to be brought to camp, the child may keep it in the front office for safe keeping on our designated Cell Phone Wall.

SECURITY PROCEDURES

During camp hours, anyone not employed by East Hill will be required to enter the Tindall Christian Activity Center (TCAC) through the entrance facing Miccosukee Road. The side door facing the parking lot will be kept locked at all times.

When you arrive at the door, a security button is located to the left for you to press. You must stand in front of the button until you're allowed entry (there is a camera attached). You may be required to either show some form of identification, your child's pick-up pass, or say your child's name. **PLEASE DO NOT PULL ON THE DOORS!** Once you've entered the building, please come to the window of the front office for any assistance you may need. **Please do not walk around the building unless escorted by a staff member or given permission by the front office.**

No child will be released to an adult without proper identification. (Which can be seen in "Picking Up Your Child")

DAILY CHECK-IN

1. Each morning the children will be checked in for camp in the designated area of the front lobby.
2. Once checked in, the camper must store their swim bag and lunch in their specified area.
3. Children will be told where his/her group is.
4. If a child comes in after 9:15am, they must check-in with the front office.

NO EARLY DROP-OFF

Please do not drop off your children before 7:30 a.m. Staff members are not assigned to supervise children before this time and the building will not be open.

PICKING UP YOUR CHILD

You can avoid timely delays when picking up your child by:

1. No cellphone use. This is for the safety of children, staff, and other vehicles.
2. Having your summer security car pass.
3. Having picture identification if you forget the above.
4. If your child is in an activity inside the building, your child will be radioed to the front office. However, in any delays, we will allow you to go to the activity to get your child. Keep in mind that gathering all of their belongings while you wait will expedite the process.
5. If your child is outside of the building (Chapel, Outdoor Games/Playground), the front office will provide you with a security slip with your child's name, group number, date, and verified

initials for you to locate and get your child. You **may not** go to any outside activity without retaining a security slip first.

6. If picking up inside, please make sure you're signing out daily in the notebook located in the front office.
 7. PLEASE NOTE: If someone comes to pick up a child without a pick up pass who is not on the list, a phone call will be made to parents/guardians for verification.
- During curbside pick-up option (5:00 – 6:00 PM), please have your summer security car pick-up pass or Driver's License. The pass must be displayed on the driver's side dash, visible through the front windshield. **Car pick-up passes from previous programs are not valid.**

*We will need legal documentation for cases in which a legal guardian is not allowed to pick up their child. All of this is for the safety of your child and we appreciate your full cooperation in the implementation of our system. **We will not release a child without proper identification.**

TARDY PICK-UP POLICY

Our Summer Day Camp Program closes at 6:00 p.m. After this time we will **charge a \$5.00 late fee for every 5 minutes a camper remains at East Hill.** You will be required to **park in a space** and come inside at this time and present the staff with a pick-up pass or driver's license in order for us to release your child. Please do not park in the pick-up line. Please cooperate by picking up your child on time. Our staff has other responsibilities after 6:00 p.m. Please call us as soon as possible if there is an emergency that will cause you to be late. Frequently tardy parents will be asked to remove their children from the program.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost items can often be found if you label all your child's belongings with his/her first and last name. Check with our Main Day Camp Office for directions to our lost and found area.

MEDICATION

If your child requires medication that must be taken during the camp day:

- You must fill out the required medication form at our Main Office.
- All medication must be brought in the **original container** in which it was prescribed.
- All medication must be kept in the Main Office until time for the child to leave. Children may not pick up their medication. Parents must pick up the medication from the office.
- We **cannot** administer any medication without the completed form and the original container.
- We cannot administer any medication by phone approval. This includes aspirin, Tylenol, ear/eye drops, or any other over-the-counter medicines.

Note: Asthma inhalers are medication and subject to all of the above regulations. All of the above are required by Florida State law as stated in the Florida Administrative Code, Chapter 65c-22.006. Please call our office if you have any questions about medication.

DISCIPLINE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

FOR CAMPERS:

We expect all campers to be well-behaved. Campers will be expected to follow the staff's instructions at all times and observe the rules for each activity area. We ask parents to encourage this by supporting our rules with their children. Fighting, bullying, or any type of disrespect toward another will not be tolerated. Campers are to respect the staff, each other, and one another's possessions at all times. The use of appropriate language and behavior is expected at all times while under our care.

Children will not be subjected to discipline that is severe, humiliating, or frightening. Discipline will not be associated with food, rest, or toileting. Spanking or any other form of physical punishment is prohibited. Staff and Administration will use Christian Biblical principles to lead the children to an understanding of appropriate behavior.

Staff, when having difficulty with a camper's behavior, will:

1. Talk with the camper
2. Take away time from a desired activity
3. If needed, the child will be sent to the Director. Using our own discretion if a parent shall be contacted, The Director reserves the right to expel a child from the program if deemed necessary due to continued misbehavior, safety, or non-support from parents.

FOR PARENTS:

- Parents may not administer physical punishment in the Tindall Christian Activity Center, Preschool Building, or anywhere on the grounds.
- Full support from the parents regarding our discipline policies and procedures with their children is essential. If you have a concern or questions, we ask that you address this respectfully and not in front of your child, other children, or other parents as we feel this may potentially undermine the authority of both the parent and the Program Administrator.
- Discipline issues will be discussed with the legal guardians.
- You may not speak directly to your child's leader regarding discipline and behavior. They have been instructed not to speak to parents about these matters and are to focus on the children. You may address the Administrators with any concerns.
- Parents may not address other campers directly concerning issues regarding their child.
- If at any time a parent disrupts or disturbs camp operations by arguing, yelling, using inappropriate language, or exhibiting aggressive behavior, he/she will be asked to leave the ground immediately.
- Parents who choose to not comply with the above procedures will be asked to withdraw their child from the program.
- It is truly our hope that we can help you with any concerns you have, so please feel free to contact via phone or set up a meeting time to address any issues that might arise.

NOTE: Parents or legal Guardians are required to disclose any physical, emotional, or behavioral limitations, needs, or concerns about their child in writing prior to registration. The camp Administration reserves the right to deny your camp registration if it is determined that our Day Camp is not suited or staffed to meet your child's needs. Unfortunately, we are not staffed or equipped to provide one on one care for children with certain needs. Furthermore, we reserve the right to withdraw any child from the camp at anytime if behavioral and/or emotional problems with a child disrupt the camp's operations, another person's safety is jeopardized, or if we determine the child makes it unreasonably difficult to meet the needs of the general campers.

SEVERE WEATHER PROCEDURES

Due to the threat of severe weather in recent summers, we have implemented a formal policy regarding our pick-up procedure during severe weather. When we are experiencing bad weather that will alter pick-up, a yellow or red flag will be flying from the awning by our curbside pick-up. If a flag is out when you approach the pick-up area, then our pick-up procedure is altered until the dangerous weather has passed. What you should do when this occurs is described below.

YELLOW FLAG ALERT! *CAUTION*

When a yellow flag is flying from the awning at pick-up, it means that conditions are too dangerous for our staff and the children to come out from under the awning.

During Yellow Flag conditions:

1. Pick-up will continue with curbside service.
2. All cars will merge into the lane that is closest to the awning and there will be only one lane of traffic. We will call children's names when you get close to the pick-up area, and we will place your child in your car when you reach the awning.
3. **Pick-up will be slower and we appreciate your patience and understanding.**

RED FLAG ALERT! *REGULAR PICK-UP STOPS*

When a red flag is flying from the awning at pick-up, dangerous weather is a threat to everyone's safety. (Examples of threats include: lightning, severe thunderstorms, tornado warnings, hail, etc.) During dangerous weather outside pick-up will stop.

During Red Flag conditions:

1. Park in a designated parking space; bring proper identification inside for clearance and directions to your child. Do not park in the pick-up drive-thru zone.
2. Park in a designated parking space and wait until the dangerous weather passes then come inside with proper identification. Approximately five minutes after the dangerous weather passes, we will resume pick-up. You are welcome to come into our Center and wait out the storm.

Our Severe Weather Procedure is solely for the safety of your children and our staff.

LUNCH PROCEDURE

Groups will eat lunch inside. Water is the only beverage we will provide during lunch time. Please send your child with another beverage if water will not suffice. Hot Lunch is an additional \$32/week (\$25 for prorated week), and the option is for the whole week, not by the day.

Each Monday by 9:15am, the lunch lists for the week are finalized.

Please note: Any camper not receiving hot lunch must bring a sack lunch from home each day. Please understand that it is your responsibility to provide your child with a lunch. If a child is brought to us without a lunch, **WE WILL NOT PROVIDE LUNCH FOR THEM.**

SNACK PROCEDURE

An individually packaged snack is provided for all campers. Every camper will receive snack for the day and water only. Parents may opt to pack additional snacks for campers. Snacks are eaten at the allocated time.

\$ PAYMENT POLICIES \$

- The weekly fee for camp remains the same regardless of how much your child attends during a week.
- Payments may **NOT** be transferred to the account of another child.
- Tuition is to be paid Wednesday **prior** to the week your child is scheduled to attend to secure his/her spot.
- VISA, MASTERCARD, AMEX, CHECKS, and MONEY ORDERS. **We do not accept cash.**
*NOTE: some prepaid childcare expense cards are not compatible with our machines.
- Automatic payments can be made by filling out a necessary form. Ask the office for more information.
- **We do not take payments over the phone.**
- If your payment is not received in full by Monday at 6:00 p.m. **of the** week your child is scheduled to attend, **a \$5.00 Inconvenience Fee will be charged to your child's account.**
- If you are having difficulty paying on time, you must meet with the Director to discuss your situation prior to your child attending the scheduled week. If your request is approved, a new due date will be agreed upon.
